

Current Apple Health programs



Immigrant health coverage

- Since the Affordable Care Act, the Health Care Authority (HCA) has been serving immigrants through Washington Healthplanfinder and Washington Connection application systems.
 - Almost 100,000 immigrants have interacted with the application systems over the last year.
 - ► There are over 43,000 individuals without an immigration status eligible for Apple Health for Kids and Apple Health Pregnancy medical programs.





Apple Health programs today

- Individuals who do not qualify for federally subsidized health care coverage because of their immigration status may continue to qualify for other Apple Health programs such as:
 - Medical Care Services
 - Alien Emergency Medical
 - ► Apple Health for Pregnant Individuals
 - After-Pregnancy Coverage
 - Apple Health for Kids





Overview

- In 2022, the legislature provided funding to the Health Care Authority (HCA) to implement a new program to provide health care coverage equivalent to Apple Health (Medicaid) to uninsured adults who are ineligible for other federal programs due to their immigration status.
- ▶ HCA received additional funding in 2023 to continue with the program.
- Apple Health Expansion will launch July 1, 2024.
 - Program funding was not at the level requested.
 - ► HCA must limit the number of individuals who can enroll.



Eligibility



Who is eligible

- Washington residents who are 19 years of age and older.
- Income at or below 138% of the federal poverty level.*
- Not eligible for:
 - Other Apple Health programs based on immigration status.
 - Qualified health plans with advance premium tax credits or federally funded medical programs.

Program policies

- Where possible, HCA will use the same procedures as Apple Health, including:
 - Eligibility,
 - ► Enrollment,
 - Redetermination and renewals.
- Enrollees be able to choose one of these four managed care programs:
 - Molina Healthcare of Washington
 - UnitedHealthcare Community Plan
 - Community Health Plan of Washington
 - Coordinated Care



Program policies

- No retroactive eligibility for Apple Health Expansion.
- Clients may get retroactive coverage under:
 - Alien Emergency Medical if they had a qualifying condition in the retroactive months.
 - After-Pregnancy Coverage if they were within 12months of a pregnancy ending.
- No resource/asset limit.



Application pathways






Application pathway – for those under age 65

- Adults ages 19 to 64 can apply:
 - Online at <u>wahealthplanfinder.org</u>
 - Download the WAPlanfinder mobile app
 - ► Call 1-855-923-4633
 - ► Submit a <u>paper application</u>*
 - ► In person through navigator



Application pathway – age 65+

- Adults aged 65 or older
- DSHS manually process applications

- ► Call 1-877-501-2233
- Submit a paper application*
- In person at a DSHS Community Services Office

Application process

Managing enrollment

- HCA can enroll up to 13,000 individuals into the program.
 - ▶ If the enrollment cap has been met, an applicant who is otherwise eligible will receive a denial notice.
- All clients may purchase a Qualified Health Plan.
 - Clients under 250% FPL are eligible for Cascade Care Savings if they enroll in a Cascade Care plan.
- Staff will accept client attestation of:
 - Income
 - Citizenship/immigration status
 - Washington residency and all other eligibility factors



At capacity

- □ If the individual indicates a need for services covered under Alien Emergency Medical (AEM) and the Apple Health Expansion enrollment is:
 - ► Not limited: Individual will be approved for Apple Health Expansion.
 - Limited: Case will be reviewed for AEM eligibility.
- Both programs cover the same services as AEM.
- Individuals denied for Apple Health Expansion in Washington Healthplanfinder due to the enrollment limit will receive an eligibility notice of health coverage options.
 - ► Clients under 250% FPL are eligible for Cascade Care Savings if they enroll in a Cascade Care plan Washington State

Getting Ready to Apply

Acceptable forms – DSHS and *Washington Healthplanfinder*

- Be sure they have all the documents needed to avoid a delay in getting coverage.
- Proof of identity may include:
 - Driver license or ID card, even if issued from a foreign country.
 - Immigration documentation.
 - ► Third party affidavit or federal or state agency letter confirming identity.
- Household members not applying for coverage do not need to verify identity.
- A social security number should be provided if the individual has one but is not required. Do not provide an ITIN.



Get ready to apply – Washington Healthplanfinder

- Washington Healthplanfinder requires the primary applicant pass identity proofing before continuing with the online application.
 - Not needed for paper application submission
- Have identification information such as:
 - ► Their name and date of birth
 - Weight, height, eye color
 - Age, sex, race
- In-person ID proofing does not require uploading of documentation.
- See <u>HBE acceptable documents</u>.*



Get ready to apply – Washington Healthplanfinder

- If an individual is working with a Navigator, the navigator will be able to verify identity of their clients and uploading of documentation is not needed.
- Be sure the individual's name matches how it is spelled on the documents.
- If the individual has two last names, follow the application data entry standards on how hyphenated names should be entered.
- Example: First name Last name Last name; or
 - First name Last name-Last name or
 - First name Last name



Get ready to apply – Income

- Must provide gross monthly income for client and spouse on the application.
- If an individual wants help calculating the amount to provide on their application:
 - ► They should have:
 - > Pay stubs (month or 2 months worth)
 - Receipts that show their earnings
 - > Letter from their employer or phone number to call to get the information
 - ➤ IRS 1040: Chart of acceptable documents*



Get ready to apply - Income

- When reporting income for individuals whose income varies seasonally, individuals can choose to use either the point-in-time methodology or by calculating the monthly average.
 - ► Example: Fishermen or farmworkers who may work seasonally during the summer.



Program Hierarchy



Do I qualify? – Hana



- 68 years old.
- ▶ Income is \$950 each month.
- Lives in Wenatchee.
- Not active or eligible for other Apple Health coverage due to immigration status.
 - Yes, eligible for Apple Health Expansion through DSHS.



Do I qualify? - Carmen



- 30 years old.
- Family of 4 with monthly income of \$3400.
- Pregnant and due in January 2025.
- Lives in Everett.
- Carmen is not eligible for Apple Health Expansion as they are eligible for Apple Health for Pregnant Individuals.



Do I qualify? - Ken



- 25 years old DACA recipient.
- Income is \$1650 each month.
- Lives in Blaine.
- Not active or eligible for other Apple Health coverage due to immigration status.
 - Yes, eligible for Apple Health Expansion.



Do I qualify? – Jeff



- 38 years old.
- Income is \$1,150 each month.
- Lives in Everett.
- Meets 5-year bar in July 2027.
 - Not eligible for Apple Health Expansion as Jeff is eligible for federal subsidy; may qualify for AEM.
 - May purchase a Qualified Health Plan with tax credits or Cascade Care Savings if they enroll in a Cascade Care plan.

Do I qualify? – Natalia



- 55 years old.
- Income is \$2,200 each month.
- Lives in Bellingham.
- Over income for Apple Health Expansion.
 - All clients can purchase a Qualified Health Plan.
 - Clients under 250% FPL are eligible for Cascade Care Savings if they enroll in a Cascade Care plan.


