

Current state


- Existing palliative care relevant services
 - Comprehensive assessment and care planning for patients with cognitive impairment
 - Advanced care planning, end of life counseling
 - ► Health Home Program- care management, individual/family support, referral to community services

Health Care Authority

- Hospice coverage
 - Physician's hospice certification
 - Benefit includes care coordination, medications, home health, DME, etc.
- Pediatric palliative care
 - ► Life limiting condition with complex needs requiring case management
 - Benefit includes pain and symptom management, counseling, care conferences, etc.
 Washington State

Recent work

- ESSB 5693 budget proviso allocating funding to help build a palliative care program:
 - "design a standardized payment methodology for a palliative care benefit for the state Medicaid program and the employee and retiree benefit programs"
- Collaboration with the Center for Evidencebased Policy from OHSU
 - Review of literature
 - Stakeholder and key informant interviews
 - Listening sessions





Ongoing work

- State Policy Institute to Improve Care for People with Serious Illness
 - Washington selected by the National Academy for State Health Policy (NASHP) as member state
 - Provides Washington with expertise and technical assistance in developing a comprehensive benefit design
 - Provides venue for sharing strategies and solutions utilized by other states
 - Ongoing review and discussion on current state and options for future benefit design and payment methods
- Fall listening session
 - Attended by Washington subject matter experts and other stakeholders
