




 - > MHCP
 - > SUDP
 - Peer
 - Supervisor
- Stabilization team used for in-home stabilization expansion
 - Stabilization specialist (clinician focused on stabilization)
 - Stabilization peers
 - ▶ Care coordinator

What is <u>not</u> mobile crisis response

- Crisis response system
 - ► Co-responders
 - ► DCRs
 - Recovery Navigators
- Other important crisis providers
 - ► FCS providers
 - ► Forensic Navigators
 - ► Peer Bridgers
 - Other social services teams




