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* Five of the seven subcommittees are established by HB 1477. The Steering Committee established two additional subcommittees: Lived Experience, and Rural & Agricultural Communities

- **The CRIS Committee and Subcommittees are charged with advising the Steering Committee in developing recommendations, including, but not limited to:**
1. **Vision:** *Recommendations vision for Washington’s crisis response and suicide prevention system.*
 2. **Equity:** *Recommendations to promote equity in services for individuals of diverse circumstances.*
 3. **Service Goals:** *Identify quantifiable goals for the provision of statewide and regional behavioral health crisis services and targeted deployment of resources; Develop a plan for the statewide equitable distribution of crisis stabilization services, behavioral health beds, and peer-run respite services.*
 4. **Quality & Oversight:** *Identify crisis system goals and a process for establishing measures, targets and oversight.*
 5. **Cross System Interactions:** *Examine and define complementary roles and interactions for broad range of entities involved in the crisis system.*
 6. **Staffing/Workforce:** *Make recommendations related to workforce needs by region, including staff education and training requirements for call center Hubs.*
 7. **Funding/ Cost Estimates:** *Cost estimates for each of the components of the integrated behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system. This will inform budget needs and funding recommendations.*
 8. **Technology:** *advise on the technology and platform needed to manage and operate the behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system (Section 109 Technical and Operational Plan).*

Cross-System Collaboration Subcommittee Charge – Examine and define complementary roles and interactions among crisis system stakeholders across the continuum of crisis response.

Work To Date

- ✓ Discussed behavioral health crisis system current-state process map as a foundation to inform future-state recommendations.
 - Focused on intersections between 988, Regional Crisis Lines, and 911.
 - Identified areas to improve cross system transfers, such as common definition of “imminent risk” for transfers to 911 across all entities.
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.

Next Steps

- Next steps are to consider process map interfaces with the tribal systems, as well as children and youth.
- Future-state system interaction recommendations are pending further guidance on the scope and role of the 988 call centers and regional crisis lines.

Technology Subcommittee Charge – To examine and advise on issues and requirements related to the technology and platform needed to manage and operate the behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.

Work To Date

- ✓ Discussion and feedback on HCA development of Section 109 Technical and Operational Plan (e.g., system functional requirements, other state systems, mental health advanced directives)
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.
- ✓ Completed vendor demonstrations of example crisis system technologies to inform understanding of key issues.

Next Steps

- Review of draft Section 109 Technical and Operational Final Plan.

Credentialing & Training Subcommittee Charge – *To inform workforce needs and requirements related to behavioral health system redesign components outlined by HB 1477.*

Work To Date

- ✓ Reviewed current NSPL call center training and staffing requirements to develop baseline understanding of current state practices to inform recommendations.
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.

Next Steps

- Discuss recommendations for standardization of Call Center Hub trainings and staffing requirements.
- Discuss training and staffing for Mobile Crisis Teams and potential recommendations.

Lived Experience Subcommittee Charge – provide diverse lived experience perspectives into the development of the Washington behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.

Work To Date

- ✓ Developed shared understanding of lived experience.
- ✓ Feedback on draft Vision and Guiding Principles.
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.
- ✓ Feedback on crisis response system, with focus on Mobile Crisis Teams.

Next Steps

- Continue to bring lived experience perspectives to inform crisis response system changes needed.
- Future priority topics identified by the subcommittee for discussion, including youth services, peer support

Rural and Agricultural Subcommittee Charge – provide rural and agricultural community perspectives into the development of the Washington behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.

Work To Date

- ✓ Feedback on draft Vision and Guiding Principles.
- ✓ Feedback on approach to Medicaid claims & encounter data analysis and determining service gaps in rural areas.
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.
- ✓ Review of Mobile Crisis Teams and how to adapt in rural areas.

Next Steps

- Discussion of rural and agricultural perspectives on the behavioral health crisis response system across the continuum: a place to call; someone to come; a place to go.

Confidential Information Compliance and Coordination Subcommittee Charge – To examine and advise on issues related to sharing and protection of health information needed for an effective behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.

Work To Date

- ✓ Reviewed current NSPL call center privacy standards to understand baseline of current state to inform recommendations.
- ✓ Received update on HB 1477 Section 109 Technical and Operational Plan and discussed information privacy considerations.
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.

Next Steps

- Review and feedback on Section 109 Technical and Operation Plan
- Topics brought by other subcommittees (cross-system collaboration, technology, rural & agricultural, tribal data sovereignty)

Tribal Subcommittee Charge – to examine and make recommendations with respect to the needs of tribes related to the 988 system.

Work To Date

- ✓ Engaged Tribal government-to-government consultation process.
- ✓ Feedback on draft Vision and Guiding Principles.
- ✓ Feedback on the Initial Assessment with tribal system perspective.
- ✓ Feedback to promote equity in services.
- ✓ Parallel process to engage Tribal Roundtables and Consultation on the Section 109 Technical and Operational Plan.

Next Steps

- ❑ Tribal Roundtables and Consultation on HB 1477 Recommendations – Fall 2022
- ❑ Engage discussion of cross-system crisis response system process map and intersection with tribal systems
