

Involuntary Treatment Act for Substance Use Disorders

Secure Detox Report April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019

Updates and current status: First 12 Months of Operations

Overview:

Two adult facilities opened as scheduled on April 1, 2018. Both facilities are currently providing involuntary substance use treatment, with more capacity than originally mandated.

The data provided by the facilities are limited and only allow us to describe the general level of activity at each site: monthly admissions, county and BHO, and reason for admissions. Due to these data limitations, it is difficult or impossible to systematically and accurately describe the experiences of all patients admitted with respect to: discharges, discharge reasons, court order at time of discharge and individual length of stay. RDA has made recommendations for improving the quality and completeness of data provided by the SWMS sites and will continue to collaborate with the SWMS Team on the development of performance measures using linked administrative data for compiling for future reports.

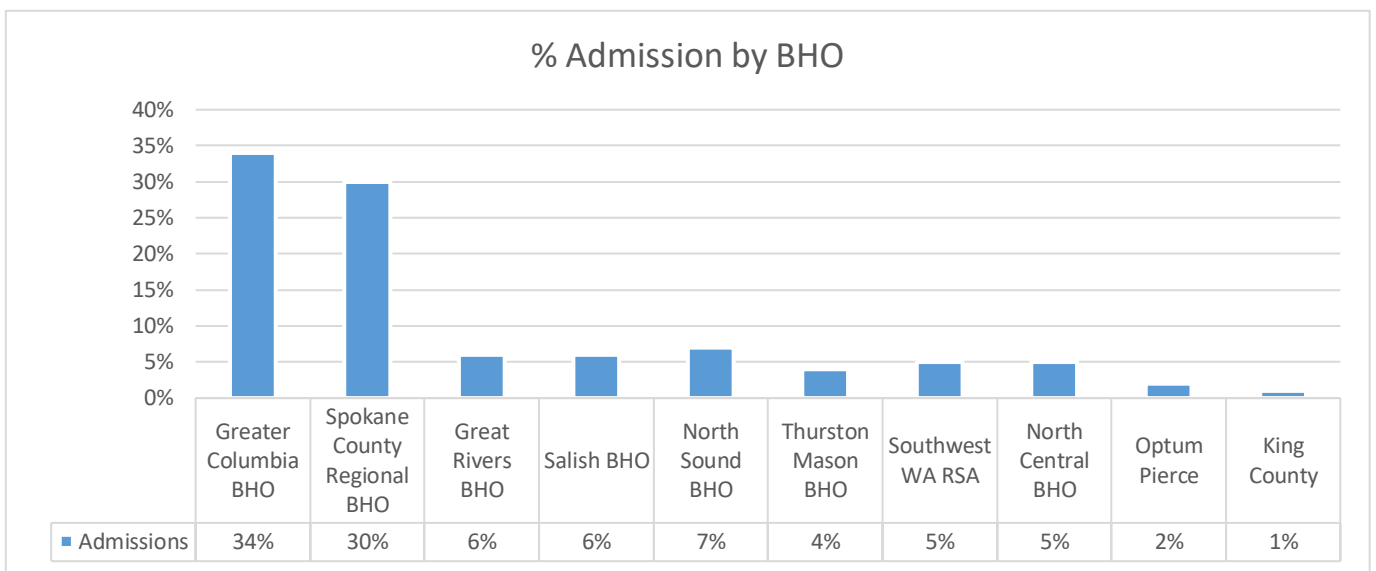
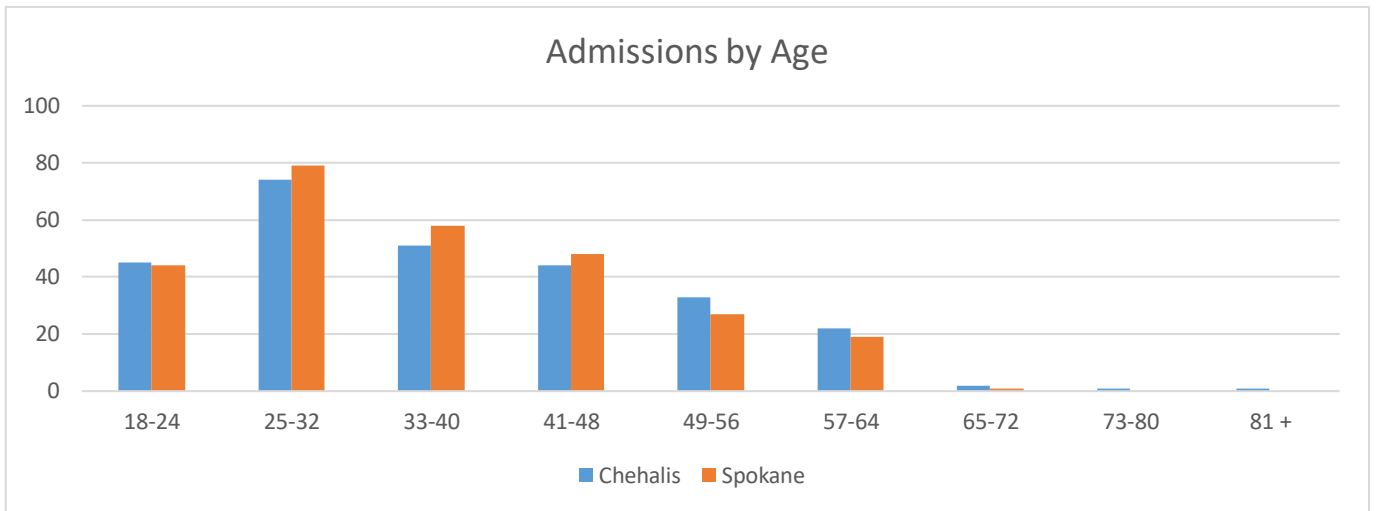
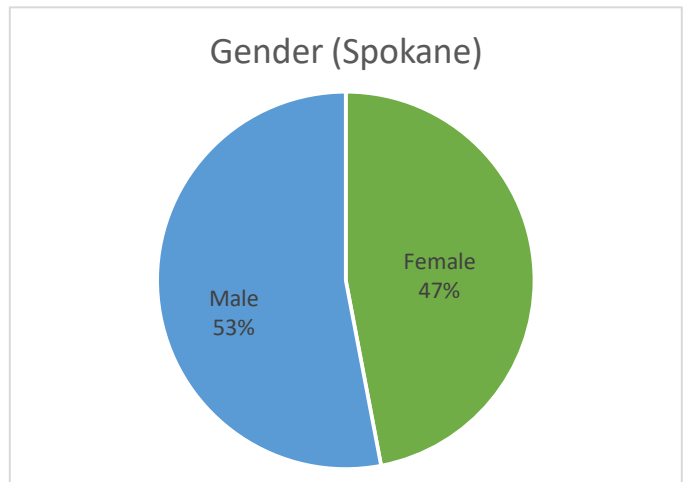
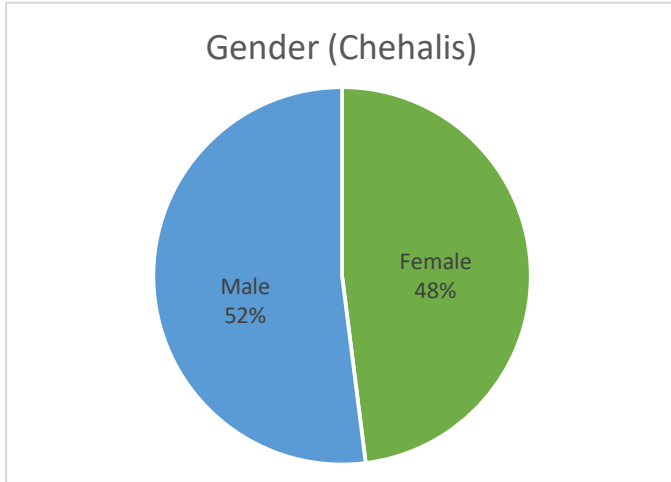

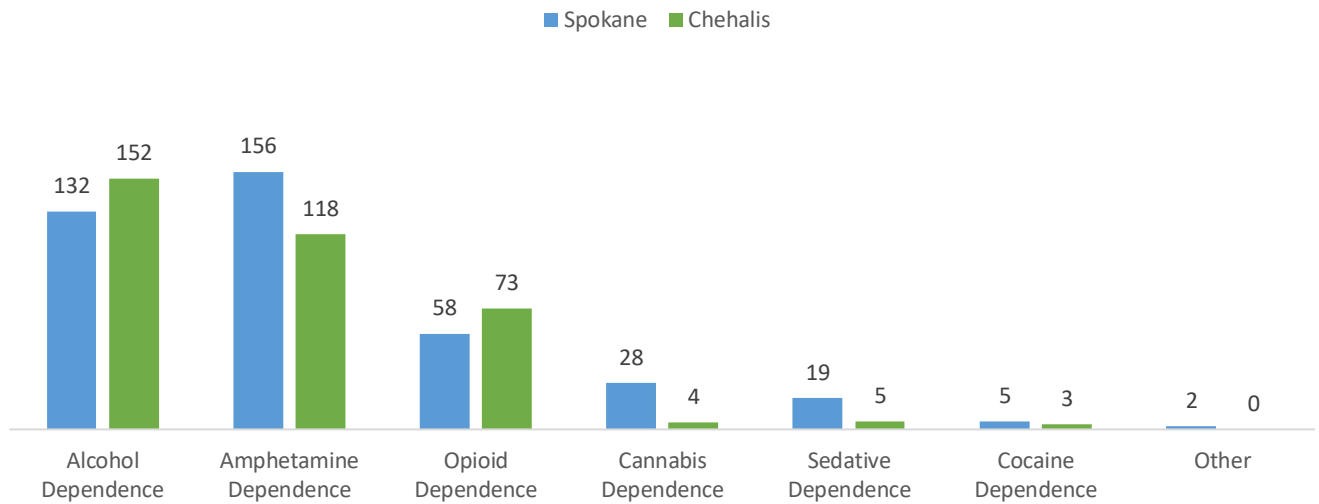

Patient Characteristics: All Admissions

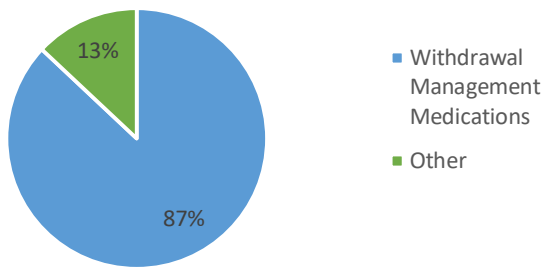


Substance Use Diagnosis*

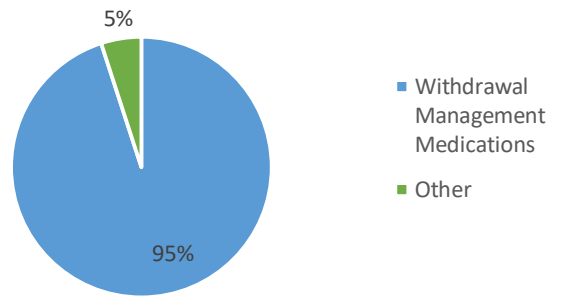

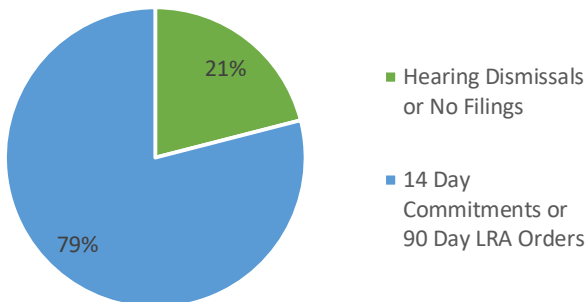
Withdrawal Management Medications (Spokane)
