DBHR updates: Prenatal - 25

- Kids Mental Health Washington (KMHWA)
 - Partners: Behavioral Health Administrative Services Organizations, Kids Mental Health Pierce County, and Developmental Disabilities Administrations
 - Setting up three regions per year to implement services
 - 8 of the 10 regions are fully implemented, 2 are finalizing their initial development process to establish delivery of services
 - Highlights (2023-4)
 - > 497+ youth served through Multidisciplinary teams (MDTs) and consultations
 - > 77,674 unique/unduplicated website visitors
 - More than 183 steering committee members guide the work across the state
 - > Shared the program with 493 webinar attendees in 2023-4
 - > Who was served:
 - → Youth referred to the program ranged from ages 1-20
 - Average age of children and youth served is 13 or younger.

DBHR updates: Diversion and Reentry

- Poundational Community Supports (FCS) Hospital Liaisons are attending New Employee Orientation at state hospitals next week and will be working with discharge social workers to increase the number of people able to access FCS services immediately after discharge.
- As a part of the Phase 3 Trueblood Implementation Plan, HCA and Commerce released an RFP to add 16 crisis stabilization beds to the Thurston-Mason region. The RFP application deadline was recently extended to Feb 28th.




DBHR updates: Adult Substance Use and Treatment Section

- New Grant Award BJA FY24 Comprehensive Opioid Stimulant and Substance Use Programs: Addressing the needs of individuals who use drugs across the Sequential Intercept Model (SIM)
 - ▶ WA was one of 6 states to be awarded this competitive \$7M, 3-year grant through the Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance
 - ► This grant will involve implementation of several projects across the state to address substance use, criminality, and the overdose crisis at every point along the SIM
- Addictions, Drug & Alcohol Institute Training Series Caring for Patients with Opioid Use Disorder in the Era of Fentanyl
 - This interactive 4-part webinar series will feature presentations and dynamic discussions on a range of topics, including medications for OUD in pregnancy, managing precipitated withdrawal, breaking barriers to methadone, and considerations for tapering.
 - ► This series is for anyone in WA State involved in treating people with OUD. All disciplines are welcome.

Behavioral health legislation

- SB 5242: Establishing an interactive screening program to improve access to behavioral health resources for health care providers.
- ▶ HB 1469 / SB 5361: Requiring HCA and OIC to delay adoption of the updated ASAM Criteria, 4th edition, until January 2028.
- ▶ HB 1282: Addressing the disclosure of health information for care coordination.

HB 1218

- Governor Inslee's request legislation re: Trueblood
- Concerning persons referred for competency evaluation and restoration services.

Corrections and issues impacting justice-involved individuals

- SB 5031: Concerning health care coordination regarding confined individuals.
- SB 5139: Concerning reentry council.
- ▶ HB 1113: Concerning accountability and access to services for individuals charged with a misdemeanor.

Youth, young adult, and student behavioral health (school-based services)

- SB 5082: Creating a housing assistance program for youth enrolled in extended foster care.
- SB 5126: Establishing a statewide network for student mental and behavioral health.
- ▶ HB 1272: Extending the program to address complex cases of children in crisis.

SB 5083 / HB 1123

- HCA agency request legislation
- Ensuring access to primary care, behavioral health, and affordable hospital services.

Problem gambling

- ▶ HB 1222/SB 5196: Concerning public inspection and copying of proprietary financial and security information submitted to or obtained by the gambling commission.
- ▶ **HB 1362:** Creating a gambling treatment diversion court pilot program to be conducted by the administrative office of the courts.

Community & public safety

- SSB 5098: Restricting the possession of weapons on the premises of state or local public buildings, parks or playground facilities where children are likely to be present, and county fairs and county fair facilities.
- ▶ **HB 1220:** Concerning appropriate response to assaults by individuals in behavioral health crisis.
- SSB 5067: Concerning impaired driving.
- ▶ HB 1146: Improving access and removing barriers to voting in jails and state hospitals.
