Dear Community Partner,

Thank you for your partnership in the development and launch of several recent initiatives that have expanded health coverage to immigrant communities throughout Washington. In Washington state, we remain committed to providing pathways to health coverage for all Washingtonians, regardless of immigration status. In response to concerns we are hearing from affected communities, we wanted to share the following:

- Various health coverage programs for immigrants remain available through Washington Healthplanfinder:
 - DACA Recipients: Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients and other people with qualifying immigration statuses can access increased federal savings through Washington Healthplanfinder as of Nov. 1, 2024. The annual open enrollment period ends Jan. 15, 2025.
 - Note: The Dec. 9 federal court decision blocking DACA recipients in 19 states from accessing health coverage does not affect DACA recipients in Washington state.
 - o <u>Immigrants who are undocumented</u>: Immigrants who live in Washington can buy health insurance through Washington Healthplanfinder, even if they are an immigrant who is undocumented. They do not need U.S. citizenship, a green card, a Social Security number or other immigration papers.
 - Washington Apple Health programs: Individuals who are not citizens may be eligible for free or low-cost Apple Health coverage through Washington Healthplanfinder, depending on their circumstances. Apple Health is available year-round.
- The safety of individuals and families applying for health coverage is important to us. Federal and state laws continue to protect the privacy of people who apply for health insurance through Washington Healthplanfinder.

- Information about immigration status will be used only to determine eligibility for coverage and <u>not for immigration enforcement.</u>
- Under current law, getting health insurance coverage does not affect immigration status or citizenship applications. Applying for or receiving health insurance, and receiving financial assistance to pay for the insurance, does not make someone a "public charge."
- Free, confidential help from trained, local assisters is available in many languages.

- The Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA), Washington State Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) and Washington Health Benefit Exchange (Exchange) do not share information about clients with anyone unless authorized by the client themselves.
