Immigration Status Eligible for Apple Health or Tax Credits

Eligible status for Apple Health or Tax Credits

- ▶ Individuals with the following immigration statuses are eligible for Apple Health **or** Advanced Premium Tax Credits:
 - ▶ U.S Citizens/Nationals
 - ▶ Lawful Permanent Resident within their 5-year bar
 - ▶ COFA (Citizens of Micronesia, Marshall Islands, Palau)
 - ▶ Asylee
 - ▶ Refugee
 - ▶ Temporary Protected Status
 - ▶ Cuban/Haitian Entrants
 - ▶ Parolee
 - ▶ Battered Spouse, child or parent (VAWA)
 - ▶ Granted withholding of deportation/removal
 - ▶ Non-immigrants with work Visa (H1, H-2A, H-2B), Student Visa, U-Visa, T-Visa

Eligible status for Apple Health or Tax Credits

- ▶ Continuation of individuals eligible for Apple Health **or** Advanced Premium Tax Credits :
 - ▶ Deferred Enforced Departure
 - ▶ Deferred Action status (excluding DACA)
 - ▶ Lawfully temporary resident
 - ▶ Administrative order staying removal
 - ▶ Member of a federally-recognized Indian tribe or American Indian born in Canada
 - ▶ Applicants for Temporary Protected Status with employment authorization
 - ▶ Applicants for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status
 - ▶ Applicants for Victim of Trafficking Visa
 - ▶ Applicants for adjustment for Lawfully Permanent Resident (LPR) status

SSN

- ▶ While some of the immigration statuses in both groups are similar, having the status of “employment authorized” provides an individual with a valid Social Security Number (SSN).
 - ▶ Those issued a valid SSN can file taxes and are eligible to get federal tax credits, making them **ineligible** for Apple Health Expansion.
