#### American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Criteria

The ASAM Criteria is the most widely used and comprehensive set of guidelines for placement, continued stay and transfer/discharge of individuals with substance use disorder and co-occurring conditions. The ASAM Criteria defines the treatment criteria and levels of care for the treatment of substance-related and co-occurring conditions. The ASAM Criteria structure is the underlying framework for our service codes, fiscal assumptions. Licensed BHA providers are required to use ASAM criteria. Our MCOs use the ASAM Criteria as a utilization management tool.



# **ASAM criteria highlights**

The Adult ASAM Criteria 4th Edition is now available.

The State will adopt the new ASAM Criteria version in January of 2026.

To get ready to use the new version, the state will offer a series of training courses.

The courses will be held virtually and start in July 2024 through January 2026.

Trainings will be offered by the Train for Change Company.

The Adolescent and Transition Age Youth version is anticipated to be released in 2026.

More information will be provided as it is available throughout the ASAM training rollout.

Designed for clinical supervisors, directors, administrators, and decision makers who play a key role in implementation and ongoing support of adopting the changes within their organization.
