				The council voted on the following options defining the member at large role. Option one, have one role to take on the Secretary duties lead action items and minute review, gather agenda items. Option two: Create two roles, one as Secretary to lead action items and minute review, gather agenda items, and a second role member at large to participate in the membership committee. 17 voted in favor of option two, 1 voted in favor of option 1. The council approved the creation of a secretary position to help lead action items, minute review, and gather agenda items. The Member at large role will be to participate on the membership committee and act as a liaison between them and the executive committee. Once the revised bylaws have been reviewed and approved by the council. Requests for nominations for the secretary will go out and a virtual vote will take place. This year is looking a lot leaner with a budget deficit and will have a better understanding of where we are when the legislature releases their budgets. Sara Ellsworth (guest): Our prevention and intervention services are primarily funded through community, prevention and wellness initiatives. We have Medicaid to cover mental health and SUD treatment and then some local district contracts that match funding
