State Youth Treatment	Topic Purpose – share progress on grant goals			
Implementation Grant Update Jared Langton	Implementation update provided regarding the State Youth Treatment Implementation (SYT-I) project. The SYT-I project enhances substance use treatment for adolescents age 12-18 by targeting key areas shown to improve outcomes such as evidence-based practices, care coordination and recovery support services. The project also includes a multi-year workforce training initiative to increase the number of credentialed clinicians and clinicians trained in evidence-based assessments. The overall objective for the project is to; improve health outcomes for adolescents; enrollment in education, vocational training and/or employment; social connectedness; and decreased juvenile justice involvement. Data show 291 youth are enrolled in SYT-I services, over half are males, over half are minorities and marijuana is reported as the most commonly used substance. Most regions identified having youth and families that could benefit from WISe services who are not Medicaid eligible. Four regions identify referring youth to other programs and/or having access to 1/10 th of 1% sales tax dollars to support a small number of youth/families. The Statewide FYSPRT would like to move this information forward to the Executive Leadership Team. A few possible solutions identified by the group included: share information gathered around this challenge at a Behavioral Health Organization Administrators meeting, refer families to Community Service Offices to determine Medicaid eligibility, legislative reform for comparable services, a waiver, having a conversation with insurance commissioners and looking at parity for mental health services. An extension was granted for members to provide additional information beyond what was shared at the meeting around this topic.
