


Apple Health (Medicaid) in Washington

Federal cuts to Medicaid would jeopardize health care access for 1 out of every 4 Washingtonians

Medicaid covers preventive services, emergency care, maternity care, behavioral health care, prescription drugs, hospitalizations, transportation, and other critical treatments for enrollees. Medicaid programs and services are **state and federally** funded:

- Federal funds pay roughly 50% of most traditional Medicaid programs.
- Federal funds pay 90% of Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).
- Between 2018–2023, Medicaid covered roughly 45% of all births in Washington.
