## **Mental Health Curriculum Update**

Office of Public Instruction hired a Mental Health Instruction Implementation Specialist to facilitate the addition of mental health education curriculum in schools, including but not limited to the following activities:

- Working with the educational service districts to build awareness of learning benefits and resource availability;
- Providing training and support to school staff in the implementation of mental health education and integration into existing health curriculum;
- Facilitating office website updates to reflect available mental health instruction resources and supporting data;
- Facilitating the addition of mental health literacy components to state learning standards and updating social emotional learning standards to reflect differentiation between the two programs and the grade-appropriate nature of each program.




## Philosophy

Mental health encompasses emotional, social, cognitive, and behavioral functioning. It exists within a continuum of care that includes all domains of health and well-being, physical and emotional safety, security, social connection, identity, diversity and purpose.

The MHL curricula represents mental health and well-being at the intersection of four equally integrating core values of practice for mental health promotion and prevention efforts:

- · strengths-based
- trauma-informed
- Equity focused
- Incorporate principles of social-emotional learning






### **Learning Objectives & Vision**

### WA DOH Opioid Campaign Updates

- The WA Department of Health has been given three House Bills that instruct the development, implementation and maintenance of a statewide campaign to prevent substance use and overdose deaths
  - House Bills 5906, 1956 and 2396
    - Note that these are all tied to one funding source
- These House Bills highlight that:
  - DOH will use this campaign to educate the public about opioids (including fentanyl) and methamphetamines, the risks of substance use including the risk of an unsafe/contaminated drug supply
  - Outreach for this campaign must be geared towards youth and adults

### 988 Awareness Funding

- For Fiscal Year 24-25 we have allocated \$500k towards 988 awareness with a focus on Native Youth
  - Teaming up with existing campaign at DOH
  - We will keep you updated of new developments

### Native and Strong Lifeline Text and Chat

- E2SSB 6251 (Section 4, Subsection 9) directed DOH to:
  - Coordinate with SAMHSA and Vibrant for authorization of text and chat services for the Native and Strong Lifeline
  - Allocate funding for text and chat capabilities for Native and Strong Lifeline
- We have received authorization to move forward with NSLL text and chat
- Funding has been allocated for FY 2024. FY 2025 is dependent on the outcomes of the next legislative session.
- We are working with Volunteers of America Western Washington and Native and Strong Lifeline to amend existing contract and implement NSLL text and chat.
  - Estimated 6 months to develop infrastructure for operational readiness (develop internal processes, recruiting and onboarding additional staff, training, technology)
  - Will update again when we have dates for the timeline

### Native and Strong Lifeline Expansion

- DOH has received external inquiries about having a Native & Strong Lifeline in their state
  - Colorado, Oregon
- Vibrant, the national admin for 988, has also expressed interest in the possibility of a national Native & Strong Lifeline
- Dear Tribal Leader Letter forthcoming
  - Regardless of what this expansion may look like, DOH will ensure that quality of WA Native and Strong Lifeline service is not compromised

### 988 Georouting

- Georouting is location-based, pings to the nearest cell tower to route a 988 call to the nearest 988 call center. Does \*not\* provide exact location.
- Oct. 17, 2024: FCC unanimously voted to approve new rules for 988 georouting
  - Requires cell phone carriers to implement georouting for 988
    - Nationwide carriers must implement within 30 days
      - AT&T, TMobile, Verizon
      - TMobile and Verizon have already implemented voluntarily
    - Non-nationwide carriers within 24 months
- We will keep folks updated on new developments
