


Medicaid managed care includes individuals with Medicaid-paid perinatal encounters or individuals who were enrolled in a state-contracted capitated managed care plan for at least three of the last six months before delivery. The percent of pregnant individuals with first trimester prenatal care (% First Trimester) is the proportion of pregnant individuals who initiated prenatal care in the first three months of pregnancy among all individuals giving birth. The average number of prenatal care visits (Avg. # PNC Visits) and the month in which prenatal care began are based on information from the Washington State birth certificate. Records with missing values have been excluded from rate and average calculations. Medicaid Managed Care Plan is as of month of delivery.





"Washington State" includes all Washington individuals with deliveries for the year, regardless of Medicaid status. Calculations for the percent of individuals with first trimester prenatal care are based on totals which exclude records with missing prenatal care information. Medicaid Managed Care Plan is as of month of delivery.
