

Organizations supporting primary care in Washington

Washington Multi-payer Collaborative

The insurance plans in the Washington Multi-payer Collaborative (MPC) signed a <u>memorandum</u> <u>of understanding</u> in support of collective action to improve primary care through the WA Primary Care Transformation Initiative (PCTI).

Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)

- Washington is one of 8 states selected through the CMS to test a new primary care model, the Making Primary Care (MPC) Model.
- The CMS Innovation Center signed a <u>memorandum of understanding</u> in support of PCTI.

Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA)

HCA supports the PCTI in several ways, including:

- Participating in the Making Care Primary Model.
- Developing the <u>Primary Care Practice Recognition Program</u>.

Employers and purchasers

The Washington Health Alliance (WHA) and the Purchasers Business Group on Health (PBGH) endorsed a statement in support of Multi-payer Collaborative primary care reform efforts in October 2023.

- WHA produced reports on where Washington primary care needs to be strengthened,
 Where You Live Matters: Community Checkup Report 2024.
- PBGH has a portfolio of work supporting advanced primary care.

Washington State Medical Association (WSMA)

WSMA <u>passed a resolution</u> supporting increased investment in primary care and advocating for legislative action to finance Washington's PCTI implementation.

Greater Health Now Accountable Community of Health (ACH)

The Greater Health Now ACH piloted the Primary Care Practice Recognition Program.
