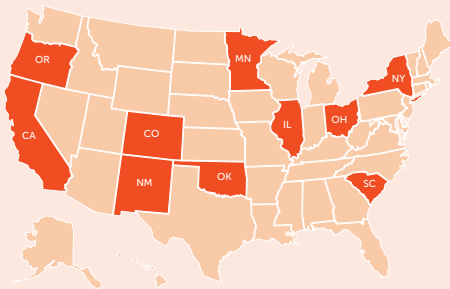
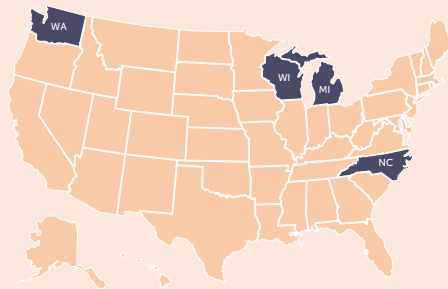


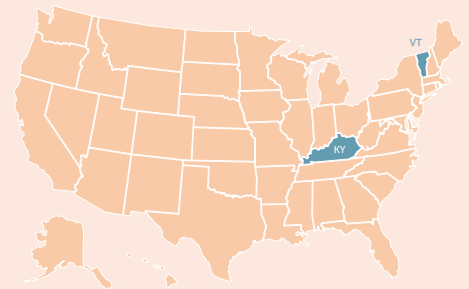
MEDICAID FINANCING + HOME VISITING a Washington State Perspective



Proprietary home visiting models such as **Nurse Family Partnership**, **Parents as Teachers**, or **Family Connects** receive some Medicaid reimbursement for allowable services



State-developed maternal-infant case management programs provided in both the home and clinic setting and fully funded by Medicaid



State-developed maternal-infant case management programs funded by Medicaid that also meet Department of Health and Human Services' **Home Visiting Evidence for Effectiveness (HOMVEE)** criteria for **Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV)**

Most common Medicaid authorities

- Targeted case management
- Waiver
- 60-day postpartum eligibility period
- Early and periodic screenings, diagnostic and treatment



Typical provider requirements for Medicaid financing

- At least an Associates degree plus experience and supervision
- Licensed registered nurses, public health nurses; licensed mental health professionals
- Home visiting model affiliation
- Certification as a case management agency
- Medicaid enrolled provider

- 1 Pursue alignment and coordination between home visiting and Medicaid
- 2 Negotiate state plan amendment for allowable home visiting services
- 3 Strengthen existing Medicaid maternal and infant health case management program
