3:10 – 3:50	The Workforce and Rates Subgroup is an advisory group of the Children and Youth Behavioral Health Work Group (Work Group). The Work Group provides recommendations to the Legislature to improve behavioral health services and strategies for children, youth, young adults, and their families and includes representatives from the Legislature, state agencies, providers, tribal governments, community health services and other organizations as well as parents of children and youth who have received services. Their work is to ensure that all children, youth, and families have access to high quality, equitable, well-resourced behavioral health education, care and supports where and when they need it.			
	The goal of the Workforce and Rates Subgroup is to identify and recommend solutions to workforce challenges that will really make a difference in the current workforce crisis but also to have strategies to stabilize it for years to come. Although a workforce shortage existed before the pandemic, the pandemic has made it worse. Legislation brought through funding in 2022 to help with workforce challenges such as raising the Medicaid rate by 7% and workforce stabilization dollars for agencies. Turnover is a significant issue, as is the caseload size for behavioral health professionals.

Summit Overview and FYSPRT Support Dialogue Karen Kelly and Statewide FYSPRT Tri-leads 4:20 – 4:55	At the Children's Behavioral Health Summit in May 2022, one of the breakout sessions was related to FYSPRTs. The Statewide Tri-leads teamed up with Karen Kelly, the Project Director for the Statewide Family Network to share a broad overview of the summit and the dialogue from the FYSPRT breakout sessions at the summit and also want to explore how the Statewide FYSPRT, Regional FYSPRTs and Statewide Family Network can support ideas that came from the FYSPRT breakout session. Some of the themes that came from the FYSPRT breakout sessions at the summit include family voice and choice is honored and in addition to gaining knowledge about services and having an impact on those services, there is also connection and support at the Regional FYSPRT table. Some barriers identified include increasing youth voice, families and youth maybe not knowing benefits of FYSPRT, not enough equity diversity and inclusion and family's distrust of the system.
