Additional Information and Resources

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The key responsibilities of the task force members, as outlined in the proviso SB 5950 <u>*5950-</u> <u>S.SL.pdf (wa.gov)</u>, include:

- **Meeting and Frequency:** Legislative members must convene the initial meeting of the task force by August 1, 2024. Subsequent meetings will be held at least quarterly.
- Leadership: The task force will be co-chaired by one legislative member and four tribal leader members chosen at the first meeting.
- **Summit:** In fiscal year 2025, the task force will convene a summit with state agencies, federally recognized Indian tribes in Washington and adjacent states, urban Indian organizations, and tribal organizations.
- **Tasks and Objectives:** Review laws and policies on opioid and fentanyl use, illicit sale, jurisdictional authority, tribal exclusionary authority, and impacts on American Indian and Alaska Native people. Develop recommendations for legislative and executive policy changes and budget initiatives to address priority areas from the May 2023 Washington state tribal opioid and fentanyl summit.
- **Reporting:** Submit a status report, including initial findings, recommendations, and progress updates, to the governor and legislative committees by June 30, 2025. The report should include recommendations for new statutes, amendments, executive actions, regulatory changes, and budget requests, with possible fiscal analysis of implementation costs.
- **Stipends:** Eligible task force members may receive a stipend of up to \$200 and other expenses per day for attending official meetings.
